

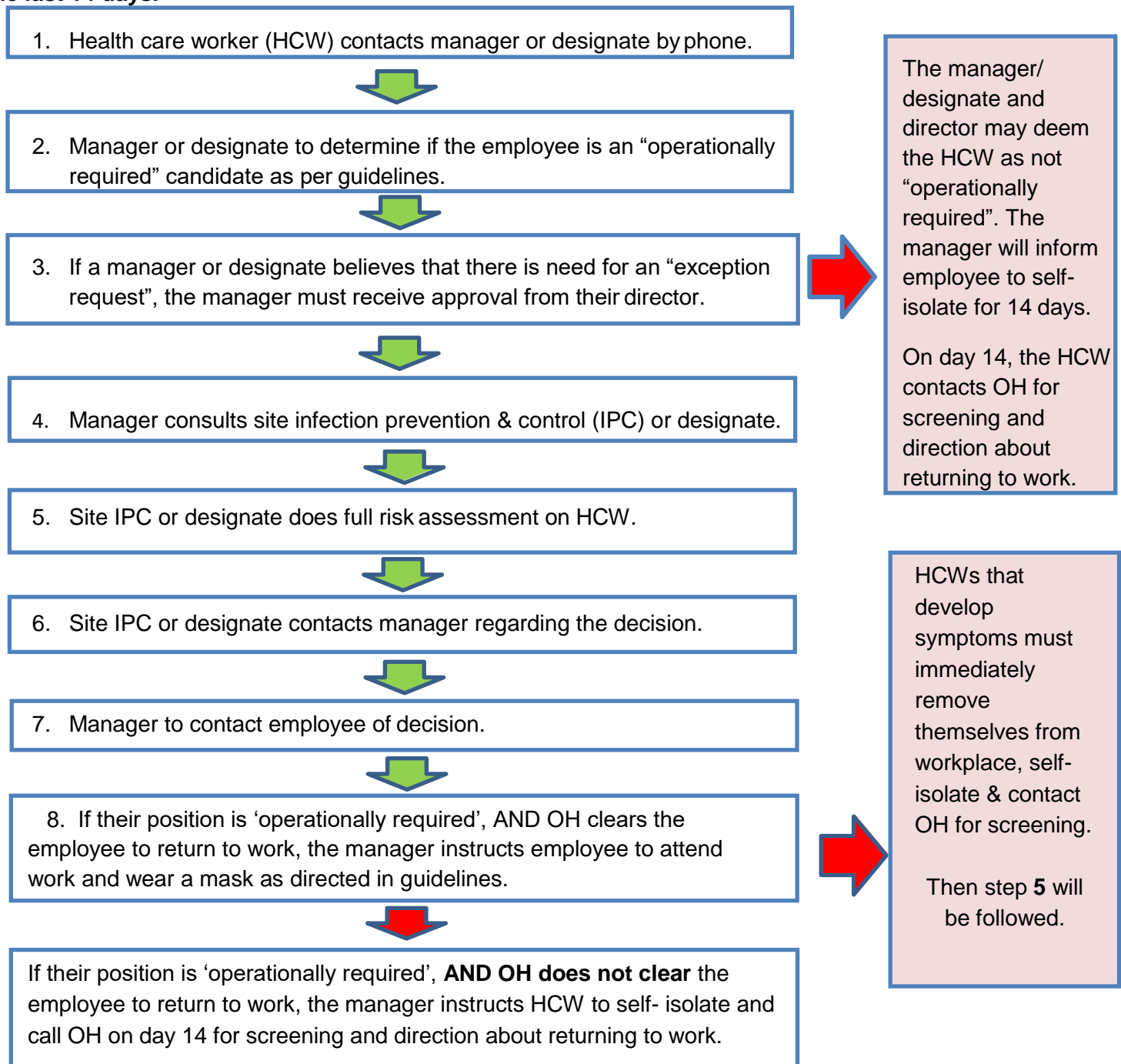
Algorithm for Screening Manitoba Health Care Workers (Physicians and Staff) Who Are Asymptomatic and Have Traveled Outside of Manitoba in the Last 14 days - Latest Updates will appear in BLUE

This algorithm is to be used as a companion to the COVID-19 Guidelines for Screening of Manitoba Health Care Workers (Physicians and Staff)

Note: Occupational Health will be denoted as OH in these Algorithms.

This guideline has been reviewed and adjusted to reflect Southern Health-Santé Sud protocols and policies.

Unvaccinated Health Care Worker - Asymptomatic and has traveled within Canada in the last 14 days.



****Fully vaccinated individuals are those who have received both doses (any combination) of an approved two dose COVID-19 vaccine (AstraZeneca, Pfizer, Moderna), OR a single dose of an approved single dose COVID-19 vaccine (Janssen/Johnson & Johnson) with more than 14 days having passed since receiving the second dose.**

Fully vaccinated health care workers who have travelled and who are exempt from the requirement to self-isolate must pass self-screening for symptoms and exposures. Health care workers who meet all of these criteria, and who are asymptomatic, are not required to contact their site Infection Prevention & Control Practitioner or designate for occupational health screening prior to returning to their workplace.
