I would like to start this week with a message of heartfelt thanks, expressing my deepest gratitude to our healthcare team, the thousands of employees, medical staff and volunteers who have been working tirelessly and constantly above and beyond since the start of our COVID-19 response. Your role has been vital to keeping each other safe in this time.

Clinical Response

- As I am recording this message, new provincial guidelines for Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) have just been released. As we do with all provincial protocols and guidelines, a Southern Health-Santé Sud working group will be reviewing these today to gain a full understanding. Regional implementation will be in consistent alignment with provincial direction. More information will be included soon in a Southern Health-Santé Sud Call to Action. Thank you for your patience and understanding.

- Over the past week, the number of lab-confirmed positive and probable positive cases in Manitoba has slowed significantly. Although this is very good news, it does not mean that we can relax our efforts to flatten the curve. It does however show that our efforts are proving to be effective.
- Effective April 19, all Emergency Departments are required to test any patients that present with Influenza like Illnesses.

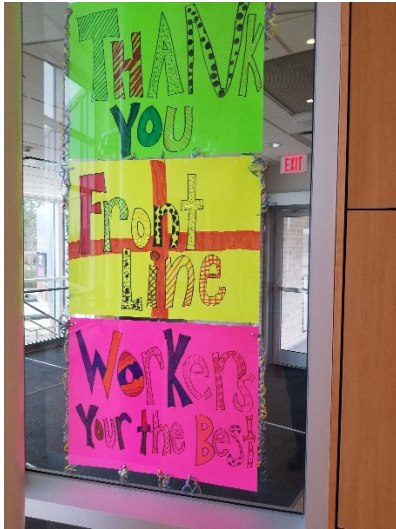
